



The San Francisco School Re-enrollment and Tuition Policy 2010-2011

Re-enrollment Requirements

Re-enrollment for the 2010-11 school year requires a non-refundable tuition deposit of \$1,900 and a completed SFS Re-enrollment Form for each student. The \$1,900 tuition deposit should be **made payable to The San Francisco School** and included with the completed **Re-enrollment Form** (attached). The deposit is directly applied to your 2010-2011 tuition balance. In order to reserve a space for your child next year, the deposit and form must be received by **Wednesday, February 17, 2010**. After that date, re-enrollment will be accepted on a space available basis only.

Re-enrollment is not complete until all charges for the 2009-2010 school year have been paid. If charges are still outstanding at the end of the term (May 1, 2010), the school reserves the option to consider the re-enrollment withdrawn, and may proceed to accept candidates for that place.

Re-enrollment for the new school term is, of course, dependent on successful completion of the preceding term. The school reserves the right to deny re-enrollment or continued enrollment, even when all fees have been paid and accepted, if circumstances subsequently arise which, in the judgment of the school, indicate that continued enrollment would not be in the best interest of either the school or the child.

Tuition Payment Options

You will be automatically reenrolled in the same TMS payment plan that you selected last year. TMS will send you a billing statement approximately 25 days prior to each payment due date. Payments are due no later than the **fifth** of the month. You may make payments by check or money order payable to **Tuition Management Systems**. Please allow enough time to assure on-time payment to avoid assessment of a late fee.

If your tuition is **automatically debited** from your bank account, this will continue unless you request a change. If you want to initiate direct debit for the first time you may either set this up on-line (**afford.com**) or contact Rahna Brown in the Business office. If you have any questions about your payments, simply call TMS at 1-800-722-4867, and one of TMS' education payment partners will be happy to assist you. You may also access your account online at **afford.com**. Questions about the amount of your bill or changes to your account should first be directed to Rahna here at school (rbrown@sfschool.org).

Following is a summary of the payment plan options being offered next year for the balance of your child's tuition:

1. **One Payment** 100% of tuition balance due on August 5, 2010. Late fee applies.*
2. **Four Payments** Tuition payments due quarterly on July 5, 2010, September 5, 2010, November 5, 2010 and January 5, 2011. This plan includes a billing enrollment fee of \$42 but no finance charge. Late fee applies.
3. **Ten Payments** Tuition payments due monthly, starting July 5, 2010 and ending April 1, 2011. This plan includes a billing enrollment fee of \$150, but no finance charge. Late fee applies.

Tuition Fees

Following are the 2010-11 tuitions for pre-school through fifth grade and for middle school, with a breakdown of payment amounts and due dates for each tuition payment plan.

Payment

Selection of your payment option should be made on the Billing Form. Please keep in mind that the tuition payment plan is not a loan. A flat late payment fee of **\$40 per month** will be applied to delinquent amounts. If a payment is more than 45 days in arrears, the child may

not be permitted to continue attending school. **Before children can start the school year, the second semester, or the Summer Program, all obligations from the previous period must be met.** Payment of tuition is considered the joint responsibility of the parents or guardians listed on the initial application and subsequent re-enrollment forms. Records of the account may be made available to either parent.

Tuition Refunds

The school cannot reimburse parents for absence due to illness or temporary withdrawal. There will be no refund for a withdrawal during the last three months of the school year (April-June) in the Preschool and no refund for withdrawal **at any time** during the year for the Elementary or Middle School program. A parent wishing a refund must give written notice of intention to withdraw one month prior to the date of withdrawal.

One-Year Withdrawal

Occasionally a family wishes to temporarily withdraw (or not re-enroll) their child for a full school year. In order to guarantee that the space will remain open for your child, SFS requires 75% of full tuition for the year that the child is absent. A re-enrollment application must be completed requesting the space to be held open and agreeing to pay the partial tuition. No deposit will be required until the February prior to the child's return to school. Tuition can either be billed through the TMS billing service or full payment can be made in advance directly to SFS. No tuition reduction is offered for a partial year leave.

Family Partnership

In order for the school to work successfully with students, it is necessary that parents/guardians be involved. On rare occasions it can happen that the match between the parents and the school is not a good one. In the event that the relationship between the parents and the school deteriorates to the point of becoming disruptive and counterproductive, as determined by the Head of School, the school reserves the right to require that the family withdraw the student.

Extended Day – Please Read Carefully

Extended day is available for advance purchase in blocks (see chart below). Extended day is from 7:30 to 8:00 am and from 3:15 to 6:00 pm. There is no extra charge in the morning if your child arrives at school after 8:00 am. To participate in the Extended Day Program, you will be asked to pre-pay a **minimum of 10 extended day blocks** (15 hours of extended day).

Any child who arrives before **8:00 am** will be charged ½ (0.5) block. The after-school program will be divided into **two 90-minute blocks**.

- The first block will be from **3:00 to 4:30 pm**. Any child at school after **3:15 pm** will be charged one minimum 90-minute block.
- The second 90-minute block will be from **4:30 to 6:00 pm**; however, if you pick up your child between **4:30 and 5:15 pm** you will be charged 1.5 blocks; if you pick up your child between **5:15 and 6:00 pm** you will be charged 2 full blocks.
- There will be a **½ block per minute late fee** if your child is not picked up by **6:00 pm** when the school is officially closed.

The extended day payment information will be sent out together with your Emergency

Release forms in late July. You will have two payment options: (1) a 10-month billing plan through TMS (a minimum of 100 blocks); or (2) pre-pay directly to The SFS

In general, with the exception of select Middle School programs (e.g. Yearbook, interscholastic sports teams) **whenever a child is at school before 8:00 am and after 3:15 pm they will be charged for extended day**. There will be additional fees (**on top of the extended day charge**) for special class offerings such as instrumental music, Spanish, chess and tutoring. These fees will be announced by e-mail each session and sign-ups or changes can be made on-line through your Drupal account. For students on Indexed Tuition the **extra fees** will be indexed at the same rate as the tuition. Your award letter will indicate what this rate will be for 2010-11.

There is **no refund** for unused extended day hours, so please estimate your needs as closely as possible. With 172 school days, the maximum available blocks are 86 morning blocks and 344 afternoon blocks (total of 430).

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Indexed Tuition

The purpose of the Indexed Tuition Program is to assure the access and the economic diversity of the San Francisco School. For this reason, not every student is charged the same tuition. Families that apply and qualify for reduced tuition pay a tuition level that takes into consideration what they are able to afford, based on a complex calculation done through the school and Student Service (SSS), a financial service of the National Association for Independent Schools. The school considers this calculation together with each family's special circumstances and available funds (\$1.028 million next year). This year 35% of our students pay tuitions that are below the maximum.

Once a student is awarded an "indexed tuition", the school is committed to continuing to set his/her tuition at a level that reflects their family's calculated ability to pay. If you are paying the maximum tuition for your child/ren and you wish to be considered for an indexed tuition, please submit an application. The school reserves some funds each year for families whose circumstances have changed or who can no longer afford full tuition. Applications are available on the SFS website www.sfschool.org/admissions/index_tuition.shtml or may be picked up at the front desk. If you missed the February 1, 2010 deadline for sending the forms to the SSS, please contact Miriam Phillips in the Business Office ASAP. The first round of indexed tuition decisions for returning families will be made by February 26, 2010. Preference for indexed tuition goes to continuing students with all information submitted in a timely manner. **For families on indexed tuition, the re-enrollment deposit is 10% of the amount you paid in tuition for the current year;** your deposit remains refundable until the decisions have been announced.

Beyond Tuition

Since tuition does not pay the full cost of a child's education at The San Francisco School, all families are expected to participate in the Annual Fund and in periodic campaigns for capital improvements at a level consistent with their capability. This participation is key to maintaining moderate tuition and an economically diverse student body. In addition to voluntary financial contributions, parent participation is essential to the overall functioning of the school. We expect all school parents to be personally involved as volunteers in a capacity appropriate for their interests and skills.
