Join us to explore our planet, one continent at a time while learning Spanish and German. Students learn animal names, days of the week, counting, songs and simple phrases in both German and Spanish. We investigate different cultures through stories, special foods and games. Campers add to the fun by sharing their personal connections to various locations where they have traveled, have friends, or have ancestral roots. In the spacious North Classroom, students enjoy art activities, circle time and free choice options (and a nap for the 4-year olds). Outdoors, we ride tricycles, build forts and create sandcastles. On hot days we turn on the hose for water slides, rivers and volcanoes. Twice a week we venture to Palega Park to picnic and play games. Campers bring lunches, bathing suits, and a change of clothing. The camp will be run by experienced year round San Francisco School staff: **Harald Fröhlich**, who will be joined by **Nova Ray** and our Spanish teacher, **Jennifer Baron**.

There will also be time for yard play in our adventure playground, and read-alouds from food-themed books.
