



Fins, Feathers, Fur & Fun

Ages: 4 year old to entering 1st Grade

Explore the world of animals while learning Spanish and German. Students learn animal names, days of the week, counting, songs, food items and simple phrases in both German and Spanish. We will be visited by the Insect Discovery Lab with their incredible live insects and by Jane Wattenberg author of "Henny Penny" and her feathered friends.

In the spacious North Class room, students enjoy art activities, science projects, circle time and free choice options (including a nap for the 4-year olds). Outdoors, we ride tricycles, build forts and create sandcastles. On hot days we turn on the hose for water slides, rivers and volcanoes, and we play and dance in the sprinkler. Twice a week we venture to Palega Park to picnic and play games. Campers bring lunches, bathing suits, and a change of clothing.

Spanish teacher **Laura Juarez**, originally from Argentina, worked with us last year and will be back again this summer to join **Harald Fröhlich**, a bilingual English/German speaker, and a year-round preschool teacher in the North Class of The San Francisco School, as well as two Junior Counselors.



Kitchen Wizardry

Fun is on the menu in Vivian's all new summer camp! From savory soups, and creative casseroles, to fruit crisps and "stained glass" cookies, we will cover the basics of peeling, mixing, simmering, and baking while focusing on the creativity of cooking. We will shop for the freshest produce on San Bruno Avenue, harvest herbs from our garden, set the table for a daily communal lunch, and end the session with a feast! But that's not all! We will push the boundaries of cooking as an art form with edible art projects, including bread sculptures, gumdrop and toothpick structures and candy mosaics. We'll also read aloud from food-themed books, write and illustrate our own recipes, and play indoor and outdoor games.

Limited to just 8 kids, this camp will develop advanced woodworking, drawing and architectural skills as young designers explore their imaginations to discover how strange and wonderful an inhabited bridge can be! An exhibition of bridges on the final day of camp will coincide with the concurrently running River Camp. This camp is inspired by the Living Bridges showcase in London, the most visited architectural exhibition in British history.

Kids explore art, architecture and ecology as they construct a fantastic river world with real rain and waterfalls! The finished 35-foot river landscape becomes the centerpiece for a Grand Tour for parents and friends!
