BAND WITH JAMES HARDING 4TH- 8TH Grade Thursday 7:30-8:30 a.m.

The San Francisco School band rehearses once a week before school. It is required that students have completed one year of study on their instrument and currently be working outside of band with a teacher. In the band, students work on ensemble reading skills through a varied repertoire of music. Any instrument can be considered for band; over the years, band has included: flute, saxophones (alto and tenor), clarinet, trumpet, trombone, violin, electric bass, electric guitar, piano/keyboard, marimba/vibes, and drums/percussion. The band performs at the Middle School Spring concert in May, 8th grade graduation, and within school at other various celebrations.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL WITH SOLVEIG DIMON 6^{TH} - 8^{TH} Grade Friday 3:30-4:30 p.m.

Students in this class will discuss current issues in their communities and around the world. SFS has one of the few middle school chapters of Amnesty International (AI) in the Bay Area. Middle school students who join Amnesty will choose a human rights campaign to work on this school year and work to educate our communities. ART AROUND THE WORLD

Nexplore Art is an interactive art program that explores fundamental art concepts such as color mixing, drawing, shading, texture and more. Throughout the course, students will make fun, creative and age-appropriate projects using different media such as acrylic paint, water color, charcoal and oil pastels. Hands-on activities allow students to develop a joy in learning art, enhance their creativity and build upon their own strengths and interests.

In our Art Around the World Course students get to travel around the world exploring different countries and their cultures. They then make an artistic representation of something important from that culture, learning various art techniques along the way.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC LESSONS

FLUTE LESSONS WITH SUE FLEMING 4TH - 8TH Grade Monday 3:30-5:30 p.m.*

Semester Private Lesson Fee: \$45 per half-hour lesson, Extended Day charges apply from dismissal until the time of lesson and after the lesson until pick-up *Lesson times will vary, contact Sarah swood@sfschool.org to schedule

Private half-hour lessons (with occasional one-hour group lessons for duets or ensemble pieces) for beginning, intermediate, and advanced flute students. Students will experience repertoire ranging from world music to classical, while they learn to read music and rhythms, music theory, and proper flute-playing techniques. Students will also be able to polish pieces for band and class performances. Rental or purchase of a flute and purchase of flute books is necessary for this course.

Sue Fleming has been a private flute teacher for over 44 years, and has over 35 years of experience teaching instrumental music in schools in Ohio and throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.

VIOLIN AND VIOLA LESSONS WITH MICHAEL NICHOLAS K -8TH Grade Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday 3:30-5:30 p.m.*

Private lessons for beginning or intermediate students. Students will learn how to hold the instrument, how to tune, finger placement, bowing technique and basic music theory.

Michael's background and focus is classical violin and viola, but he enjoys and teaches many genres, including folk and traditional music from around the world. Originally from New York, he studied with a handful of the finest violinists of our time including Arnold Steinhardt and Eugene Drucker and has performed in the U.S. and Europe as a soloist, chamber musician, orchestra member, and in recordings of many stripes. He previously taught at Queens College and Weston Music Center in New York and Connecticut.

Students will learn basic music fundamentals as applied to both stick and hand drumming. Students will also learn how drums and percussion can play in harmony with each other.

Woodwind master Garrett Kobsef is one of the Bay Area's best kept secrets. He has been a San Francisco resident since 2007 and honed his craft in Los Angeles for nine years prior. While studying jazz music at the University of Southern California he worked with many of Hollywood's greatest voices including Bonnie Raitt, Fleetwood Mac, and Michael Buble. Legendary composers Gerald Wilson and Bill Holman also sing Garrett's praise. His mentors are the sax players for Steely Dan, Rod Stewart, Carly Simon, Stanley Clarke, Freddie Hubbard and Tom Waits.

His versatility makes him equally at home playing jazz, reggae, salsa, funk and hip-hop. He has contributed to countless recordings, television appearances, theatre pit orchestras, and performed on the world's grandest stages including the fabled Glastonbury Festival, Red Rocks Amphitheatre, Hollywood Bowl and Walt Disney Concert Hall.

TRUMPET LESSONS WITH SCOTT JENSEN 4TH -8tH Grade Wednesday 3:30-5:30 p.m.*

Semester Private Lesson Fee: \$45 per half-hour sessions, Extended Day charges apply from dismissal until the time of lesson and after the lesson until pick-up * Lesson times will vary, contact Sarah swood@sfschool.org to schedule

Private lessons with Scott will emphasize the fundamentals of trumpet for beginners and more advanced concepts for those already playing. Lessons will be tailored to each students' needs but will include; how to read music, how to improvise, and most important, how to have fun playing the trumpet.

Scott's played the trumpet for over 40 years. He studied at the New School for Jazz in NYC and has played on both coasts and in Europe. He has recorded with and/or written for; Charlie Hunter, Stanton Moore, Katoja, Tony Toni Tone', Spearhead, Ken Burns, and others. He's taught privately and in schools with specific teaching skills in Jazz, Orff, and Mindfulness teaching methods.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

My child is interested in a class that ends at 4:30 p.m., will I be charged if I do not pick up at 4:30?

• Yes, students will be charged for any portion of time after their class ends at the \$10/hour rate.

What if the class doesn't reach the minimum numbers?

• Under enrolled courses will be cancelled and families who have registered informed via email prior to the start of the class.

What if the class surpasses the maximum number?

• Over enrolled classes will generate a waitlist for students in the case of a cancellation.

My child wants to take an instrumental lesson, what is the process?

- Email Sarah Wood swood@sfschool.org to state preference for instrument and availability.
- Instrumental lesson schedules will be arranged and families informed of lesson days/times.
- In the case of a missed lesson, please inform the instrumental music teacher, the front desk, and Sarah the morning before the lesson. If no notice is received, no refund will be given.

What are the procedures for signing my child in and out of Extended Day?

- Students in Elementary and Middle School are signed into the Extended Day program from dismissal to 3:30 p.m. using the Kinderlime iPad application.
- Students are signed out from the Extended Day program at the Front Desk upon arrival of their guardian for pickup. Authorized guardians will sign the child out using the Kinderlime iPad application. Students who are not signed out will automatically be signed out at 6:00 p.m.
- Preschool students are signed in and out across from the Preschool Extended Day Room using the Kinderlime iPad application and each families unique four digit code.

What if I am late for carpool?

- Students still in carpool at 3:25 p.m. will be signed into their choice of Extended Day drop-in options (Legarza All Sports, Learning Lab, etc.)
- Once the authorized guardian has arrived, the student will be signed out at the Front Desk and pay the rate of \$10/hour.
- If you have not already pre-purchased a punch card you will be asked to do so at sign out.
